### **Fulbright Fellowship**

The Fulbright Program enables a student to live and study/conduct research in a foreign country for one academic year. Candidates must have a definite study project in mind and have an excellent command of the language of the country. Applicants should hold a B.A. degree and be U.S. citizens. Teaching (English) opportunities are available in several countries, including France, where the Ministry of Education assigns you to a school.

### **The Paul & Daisy Soros Fellowship for New Americans**

Looking for leaders who can give evidence of creativity, accomplishment, and commitment to the US Constitution; and for whom graduate education is relevant to their long-term career goals. Those eligible must be "New Americans," which means individuals with green cards, those who are themselves naturalized US citizens, or children of two naturalized US citizen parents. A candidate may not be on a foreign student visa. Grants are \$20,000 in maintenance and half tuition wherever the student studies, for up to two years.
