The Minor in Italian Studies

The minor in Italian studies promotes the acquisition of superior language skills while offering an opportunity to explore the richness of Italian culture and literature. Emphasis is placed on developing the critical and analytical skills that enhance the understanding of literature and the other arts, and on broadening and deepening students' understanding of values foreign to their own.

Checklist. The following are the minimum 6 required courses.

I. Required Courses: five courses taken in the Italian Program at Colby. Typically, these include IT127, IT128, IT141, IT2-- (a 200-level course: offerings vary annually), and IT3-- (a 300-level course: offerings vary annually). Students beginning their study of Italian during their sophomore year, rather than in their first year at Colby, should see the Italian Studies program director or chair of the Department of French and Italian in order to discuss their progress through the minor, as should students planning to spend their entire junior year abroad.
